## **High-Value Items You Should Keep On Your Person:**

## **Shipping High-Value Items:**

- If high-value items are included in your shipment, your Service Provider must record them on the High-Value Inventory form. This form is generated in addition to the standard household goods descriptive inventory. High-value items are defined as articles that have a value greater than \$100 per pound per item.
- Before signing the High-Value Inventory form, verify that accurate descriptions of the items, such as the condition, make, model, and serial number, are included when applicable. You should indicate the estimated value of each item.
- Do not ship small, extremely valuable items such as stocks, bonds, jewelry, coin collections, etc., or items of great sentimental value such as photo albums and pictures. Pack these items in your suitcase and hand carry them, as well as any purchase receipts, and appraisals.
